

What are the main style dependent components of AD for horror scenes?


- Construction of characters

- Presentation and meaning of violence
- Sense of humour
- Style of presentation realist, abstract, grandiose, symbolic, parodic, fabulous etc.

Horror films often have their hard-core fans, who are familiar with basic genres, such as:

- zombie apocalypse, film noir, horror sci-fi etc.
- style associated with a particular director, e.g. Tarantino, Burton, Rodriguez
- style of some well-known series like Alien (with their own encyclopaedias)
- the influence of horror stories (Lovecraft, Poe, Stoker etc.) & graphic novels

Frankenweenie - AD

"Like something from a zombie film, Victor's parents are besieged by sea monkeys in a telephone box."


VIOLENCE

Mummy Hamster (Colossus)

"An ever-growing shadow lurches on the mausoleum wall, as it nears the doorway. Nassor looks stunned, as a shadow falls across his narrow face. The shadow is cast by a tiny hamster wrapped in bandages like a mummy." [Frankenweenie]

Ambiguity
