Voluntary School Groups

26 recruitment meetings in 18 schools for591 students aged 13-16

289 students from 16 schools joined the inschool training

22 Voluntary School Groups with 10 to 19 students

Training

• in-school training - 30 hrs, 289Ss

• <u>e-learning</u> – 12 hrs, **269** Ss

The full training was successfully completed by **268** students

The benefits

- 1) Illustrations as a source of information
- 2) 650 visually impaired teenagers can regularly access the press
- 3) Minimizing discrimination and exclusion
- 4) Language skills improvement in volunteers
