Tells you what you can't see

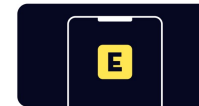
The Earcatch app provides pre-recorded audio description via smartphone or tablet. Audio description is a technique in which a voice describes what is happening on stage.

This offers people who are blind or partially sighted an optimal theatre experience.

Welcoming people who are blind or visually impaired

-  Ask them if and how you can help.
-  Respond verbally. A nod, smile or gesture will not be seen.
-  You may not be able to tell whether someone is visually impaired.
-  Guide dogs are welcome - Do not pat them.
-  In case of emergency, give instructions verbally • Inform health and safety officer.

How does it work?



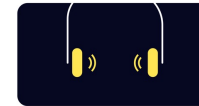
Step 1

Users have installed the (free) Earcatch app on their phone or tablet and come to the theatre with a fully charged device and headphones.



Step 2

The audio description is downloaded in the app before the show starts. The user has already been able to prepare at home with introductory videos and accessible teasers.



Step 3

Once the user is seated, they simply press 'play'. The app automatically connects to the Earcatch network that is present in the theatre.



Step 4

As soon as the show starts, the audio description automatically starts playing and remains in sync.

It is recommended to have a few power banks available to lend out to users. If their device is not fully charged, this way they can still enjoy the complete performance with audio description.

The FAQ can be consulted through the Profile tab, for more information on how to use Earcatch in the theatre. Earcatch can be used with the screen on black, so people around the user are not disturbed. Earcatch also works while the device is in flight mode (as long as Wi-Fi is active).

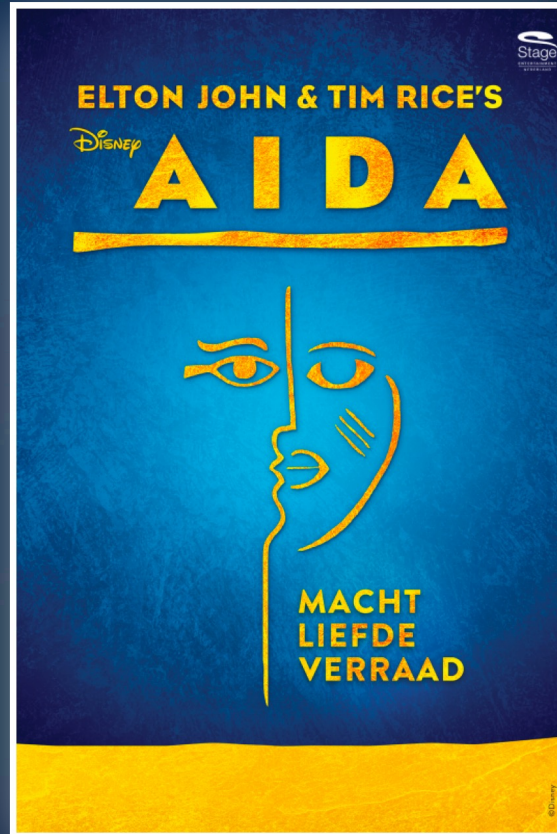
