Description

Kick-off Meeting of WIRE project (UAB, Bellaterra, Spain, 30-31.01.2023)

Kick-off Meeting of the WIRE Project: Presentation of each participant, Introduction to the WIRE project, Project Management, Open discussions, Partners objectives and activities, Debate: presentation script and student's engagement, Dissemination & Communication, Ethics and legal issues, Open discussion: foreseen challenges and key action points for next period, etc. Agenda attached.

A fundamental element to start WIRE was to define the concepts shared by all the participants, establish the chronological frameworks (in the abstract in the DoA, specified in the KoM: Exile and Maquis in Spain; Civil War and Exile in Greece; Resistenza in Italy; resistance against the communist dictatorship in Poland). In addition to dealing with issues of Management, Ethics, Funding, Dissemination & Communication, each participant presented their case study to the others, their own educational and outreach activities, as well as their strategies for engaging students in the Memory Route. It was also possible to address the common framework and comment on the strategies of the different partners in the open discussion.

Therefore, during the KoM of the consortium, the different WPs and their budget were discussed, and the different coordinated campaigns were prepared to engage the students who will participate in the Memory Route. For this, a group of students from the UAB was invited to participate in all the activities of the conference. Minutes were taken, translated, revised and conserved by WIRE's PM.

Thus, different promotional videos were produced with representatives of all the Project sites, and the materials that would be used in the subsequent seminars with students in Poland, Italy, Spain and Greece were designed. The first seminars were held in March 2023 with students from the UAB and the University of Bologna; Due to university schedule problems, the seminars in Greece and Poland will take place in April 2023.

As we understand the seminars with students as activities deployed from the KoM and within the WP itself, the attendance lists are also kept for our records: University of Bologna, March 27, 26 participants (13 female, 13 male), Universitat Autònoma de Barcelona, March 28, 26 participants (13 female, 13 male), Jagiellonian University, April 4, 24 participants (18 female, 6 male) and University of Athens, April 4, 25 participants (15 female, 10 male).

After the general Kick Off Conference held in Barcelona on January 30 – 31, where the details of the following actions were set and shared among all the project partners, MONTE started the organisation of the local Kick Off Conference to address university students' interest.

1. An official email was sent to the director of the History faculty in University of Bologna, Prof. Maria Pia Casalena. We received an immediate answer of complete and full support. She is one of the main researchers in the territory of Bologna dealing with Women History.



2. An official email was sent to Prof. Luca Baldissara and Dr. Toni Rovatti, two of the main experts dealing with World War II history and in particular with research on fascist and Nazi regimes and civilians' massacres in order for them to involve the students attending their classes.

3. A proper location was search and found in the main building of the Bologna University humanistic department and leaflets and informative materials were prepared to be sent out to students. Prof. Casalena wrote to all the first and second year history students, MONTE experts shared the invitation via social media and mailing lists to other humanistic faculties students.

3a. Posters were printed and spread in the university district, in libraries and study rooms notices boards.

4. On March 27th, experts form MONTE and the professors previously involved attended the meeting. The project WIRE was fully illustrated, the Peace School institution and methodology was described and both Prof Baldissara and Dr. Rovatti delivered a short introduction to the European and Italian historical framework and concepts feeding the WIRE project. Around 20 students attended the meeting, asking questions and already debating some issue in terms of different resistance experiences in the 4 countries involved in WIRE. Some other 10 students, non-able to attend the meeting in person, wrote to their teacher of to the MONTE experts in order to be included in the participants group anyway.

5. A follow-up email was sent to all the students, asking for an official declaration of interest to be sent in the next month.

After the general Kick Off Conference held in Barcelona on January 30 – 31, where the details of the following actions were set and shared among all the project partners, MONTE started the organisation of the local Kick Off Conference to address university students' interest.

1. An email was sent to all third-year history students at the UAB by the coordination of history studies, Dr. Ignasi Fernández Terricabras. He was present in the general KoM and has given full support to WIRE's activities. Students enrolled in a previous list (not mandatory) via Forms.

2. The documentation for the students was prepared by Virginia Mata (PRUAB), responsible for the communication-dissemination plan.

3. A 1-hour talk was given by Javier Rodrigo with the support of the resto of UAB's WIRE team. The promotional video of the Memory Route was shown and the WIRE project was explained point by point to the students, followed by half an hour of questions from the students.

1. An email was sent to a professor from the Faculty of History of the Jagiellonian University and a meeting date and program of the Kick Off Conference were set.

2. The information about the Kick Off Conference was published on VDA's Facebook page and website and on Facebook page of Faculty of History of the Jagiellonian University.

3. The promotional materials for the students were chosen and a presentation was prepared by Liliana Scelina (VDA) and Dr. hab. Barbara Klich-Kluczewska.

4. Liliana Scelina presented to students the VDA and WIRE's main goals, project activities and calendar and encouraged them to participate. Dr. hab. After the general Kick Off Conference held in Barcelona on January 30-31, where the details of the following actions were set and shared among all the project partners, ASKI started the organisation of the local Kick Off Conference to address university students' interest.

1. An invitation was sent via email to the students of the Department of History and Archaeology of the University of Athens (UoA) by the professor of History and Historiography (and president of ASKI), Dr. Vangelis Karamanolakis. The invitation included a short description of the project focused on the Memory Route. The students had to declare their interest to participate in the kick-off conference via an email to ASKI. At the same time prof. Karamanolakis and Dr. Dimitra Lambropoulou, professor of Social History at the UoA, invited the students to the kick-off conference and briefly informed them about the project in person during the classes that they teach at the university.

2. The documentation for the students and the visual presentation were prepared by Dr. Manos Avgeridis and Ioanna Vogli (ASKI), based on the material and the guidelines that had been agreed during the kick-off meeting in Barcelona and had been prepared by Virginia Mata (PRUAB), responsible for the communication-dissemination plan.



3. On Tuesday, April 4, 2023, the kick-off conference took place at ASKI's venue in Athens, with the participation of 20 students and 5 experts. During the conference and after a brief introduction by prof. Karamanolakis, Dr. Avgeridis presented the project, focusing on its historical framework, its historiographical dimensions and its methodology, as well as the various and diverse activities that it includes. The promotional video of the Memory Route was shown, and the WIRE project was explained point by point to the students. Subsequently, Dr. Angeliki Christodoulou, historian, and Ms. Anastasia Kapola, head of ASKI's archival collections, talked about the Digital Repository of Women's Life-Stories that will be the main source with which the students will work on their different tasks during project. The event ended with a 30-minute discussion with the students, that included practical, methodological, and historical questions relative to the project.

4. After the conference, a follow-up email was sent to the students, that included a Declaration of Interest and the request for a Motivation Letter in English. Through this process, ASKI will be able to select the best 10 candidates to participate in the Memory Route.








Italy. Memory Route in Monte Sole

The Memory Routers in Italy will delve deeper into the Monte Sole Massacre history, to identify issues and critical themes in relation to students' general knowledge of WWII and to the WWII history in their country of origin.

This research will be helped by Luca Baldissara, Maria Pia Casalena, Toni Rovatti, professors at Bologna University. They will lead the identification of the most crucial European history issues related to dictatorships in terms of resistance to oppression and women involvement in these groups and actions. Around April 25th (Italy Liberation Day), students will experience the memory path in Monte Sole Historical Park to learn how to "exploit", in an educational way, the power of places and biographies. They will take part in commemorative events to bring the WIRE perspective into the official speeches.






Memory Route in Greece: Podcasts on female resistance

The students will search in the Repository to select and investigate 12 life stories of women who took part in the Resistance (3 from Greece, 3 from Spain, 3 from Italy and 3 from Poland).

They will then design 12 scenarios for podcasts of 10 minutes approximately each, according to the relevant guidelines given by ASKI. During their stay in Athens, they will record the audio files which will then be edited professionally.





Spain. Memory Route in Catalonia: Memory in the Walking


The students will engage in a journey through the spaces travelled and lived by different groups and typologies of female resistance in the context of the Spanish Civil War and the postwar period.

- Memory Walk #1. Ebro: Spaces of the Battle of the Ebro. A walk to the old town of Corbera d'Ebre and "Museum for 115 days" in the same town, on the resilient women in a geographical area that significantly suffered the ravages of Civil war.

Memory Walk #2. Maqui: Maqui Route. A walk to the route of the maquis in the Vall d'en Bas. Walk#2 will show the collaboration and resistance networks of the female world within the context of the anti-Franco armed struggle. SOCLOSE digital tool for mapping will be used as a central methodology, in order to generate small personally created information pills linking geography and memory. Previous training documents will be sent to final users two weeks before the Activity.
Memory Walk #3. Exile: Exile. Visit to the Exile Memorial Museum in La Jonquera. Walk#3 will to show women and their role of resistance in concentration camps in France, as well as their role in the French resistance during World War II.

Memory Route in Poland: Write the Game

The participants will retrieve at least nine stories of female members of the Resistant from the archives of three collaborating institutions: the Museum of WWII, the Polin Museum of the History of Polish Jews, and the Warsaw Rising Museum. They will then present the stories as part of a Memory Walk together with other participants of the project and general public in Villa Decius and around Krakow. The historical sites (Villa Decius, UNESCO City of Krakow) will work as a source of inspiration for the non-conventional educational tools and as a set for presenting the storylines of females in the Resistance.

Editorial work: Transcription, edition, and translation of the archival material into the nine storylines (in collaboration with the Repository).

Scriptwriting workshops: Four day-long workshops to develop four narrative game scenarios. Presentation. Online Publication: Presentation of the four narrative games scenarios and the narrative games as educational tool.

Workshops for school students

Each class will participate in a one-day workshop on the Monte Sole Massacre site, plus three to four follow-up meetings at school to deepen examples from the past and analyse their influence in the present.

The participants will learn about the so-called "silenced resistance".

MONTE experts will lead an introductory seminar for teachers, to help them elaborate a line of research for their students. A selection of the best research works produced within the classes will be published in the Online Exhibition.

Workshops for adults

Workshops on the Monte Sole site offered during spring/summer weekends, including a "resistance walk" on Massacre Memorial Path and the production of content about the influence of historical experiences.



Publishing the results

Starting from and using the findings of the workshops, a series of books will be produced. There will be public readings and presentations.

Preparing the exhibition

A crucial question for action will be asked to members and participants of cultural associations directly linked to the activities: "Discover a woman who, with her actions, opposed oppression". The answers and the relating materials will be used for the creation of a physical exhibition.

Collecting a selection of the outcomes

Among the works prepared in the previous task, a selection will be chosen to be adapted and then published in the Online Permanent Exhibition.

The 1st phase includes archival work, creation of educational materials and scriptwriting workshops during which participants will develop narrative game scenariosinspired by biographies of Polish women in resistance. In the 2nd phase, participants will promote the narrative games and will share their experiences with the WIRE network. The outcomes of the workshops will be presented at a gaming event in Villa Decius in 2024 and open to the public later on.

During the Memory Route's activities, participants will create and use innovative tools such as: podcast, educational paths, online exhibitions, and digital repository of biographies.

The participants will engage in a gaming event in Villa Decius and open to the public, to foster networking between young educators and representatives from the creative sector.

The Game Arena will be the ideal place to present, test and evaluate the scenarios of the narrative games on female in resistance. A special Game Chamber will be organized at Villa Decius to give an open access to the public and promote the fruits of the workshops.

Exposing Memory



The participants will analyse how women victims of Francisco Franco's violence lived and resisted during the Spanish post-civil war years: from women who had to obtain guarantees to get their relatives out of a concentration camp or prison, the request for aid to be able to eat, request for favours to commute death sentences, widows who were left in situations of precariousness due to the lack of a husband, etc.

An enriched glossary of terms, historical workshops and a selection of texts and materials for the Theatrical play will be developed. A selection of results will be included in the Online Permanent Exhibition.

Series of workshops for high school students (five group-class) with materials from the Witness Archive of the Democratic Memorial, documents from the National Archive of Catalonia and the Archive of the Republic Pavilion of the University of Barcelona.

• Preparation and development of an exhibition, joint venture WIRE Online Exhibition and Democratic Memorial website.

- Dossier
- Production of a pedagogical dossier for high schools in collaboration with Edicions de la Generalitat de Catalunya.

Memory on Stage



The participants will create an *ex-novo* artistic play, where texts on women and resistance proposed in the previous work will be read and interpreted. The play will be premiered in the context of the Memory Route Final Event and will open a discussion.

Selection and re-elaboration of texts by/ for two actresses

A small theatre company in Catalonia will be selected by MEMO to work on the contents suggested in the Exposing Memory action, and to elaborate with it a play proposal for two actresses.

Rehearsal, premiere of the play, public debate

The work produced by the company will be rehearsed and premiered in the context of the Final Event. Afterwards, a public discussion will be opened, recorded, and published online.

Meetings and call for proposals

Meetings with different stakeholders (historians, oral history groups, cultural institutions, artists, teachers, and students).

ASKI will launch a call for proposals to consider different ideas and suggestions, and finally select the participants. The whole process will actively involve around 100 persons.

Public event

Design, organization, and promotion of the public event.

This open debate will actively involve around 100 persons to test and evaluate the narratives on female resistance developed by the participants during the local actions in 2023.

The discussion will allow participants to suggest further ways to promote scientific knowledge about female resistance to wider audiences through artistic representations, cultural activities, and extracurricular activities, implicating different actors (historians, groups of oral history, cultural institutions, artists, teachers, students, etc.).







Over four months, a group of 40 final-year university students will carry out four educational and research activities in the partner countries. At a Final Event held in Barcelona, students will engage in dialogue with memory agents and victims and present their own research findings to policy makers and stakeholders.



Activities

Italy. Memory Route in Monte Sole

The Memory Routers in Italy will delve deeper into the Monte Sole Massacre history, to identify issues and critical themes in relation to their general knowledge of WWII and to the WWII history in their country of origin.

This research will be helped by Professor Luca Baldissara (Pisa University), one of the most relevant Italian historians in terms of Monte Sole research and WVII studies. He will lead the identification of the most crucial European history issues related to dictatorships in terms of resistance to oppression and women involvement in these groups and actions.

Around April 25th (Italy Liberation Day), students will experience the memory path in Monte Sole Historical Park to learn how to "exploit" in an educational way the power of places and biographies. They will take part in commemorative events to bring the WIRE perspective into the official speeches.

Memory Route in Greece: Podcasts on female resistance

The students will search in the Repository to select and investigate 12 life stories of women who took part in the Resistance (3 from Greece, 3 from Spain, 3 from Italy and 3 from Poland).

They will then design 12 scenarios for podcasts of 10 minutes approximately each, according to the relevant guidelines given by ASKI. During their stay in Athens, they will record the audio files which will then be edited professionally.



Spain. Memory Route in Catalonia: Memory in the Walking

The students will engage in a journey through the spaces travelled and lived by different groups and typologies of female resistance in the context of the Spanish Civil War and the post-war period.

Memory Walk #2. Maqui Route. A walk to the route of the maquis in the Vall d'en Bas. It will show the collaboration and resistance networks of the female world within the context of the anti-Franco armed struggle. SO-CLOSE digital tool for mapping will be used as a central methodology, to generate small personally created information pills linking geography and memory. Previous training documents will be sent to final users two weeks before the activity.

Memory Walk #3. Exile. Visit to the Exile Memorial Museum in La Jonquera. Walk#3 will show women and their role of resistance in concentration camps in France, as well as their role in the French resistance during World War II.

Memory Route in Poland: Write the Game

The students of the core group will share their experiences in the creation of narrative game scenarios with Memory Routers and will present the results of their work during the workshop at Villa Decius in 2023. The possibilities of using historical sites as an inspiration for a non-conventional educational tool will be discussed.

A 2 day-long workshop for Memory Routers from 4 countries will be organized to present the creation process of narrative game scenarios and the possible use of narrative games as an educational tool in the historical education. During the workshop, the participants will create 4 narrative game scenarios.

Scriptwriting workshops. 2 day-long international workshops to develop four narrative game scenarios. Presentation.

Online Publication. Presentation of the four narrative games scenarios and the narrative games as educational tool.





The Memory Route

Academic Conference and Final Event

The Academic Conference and the Final Event will take place in Barcelona as a double-purpose activity: an international academic activity to close and present the scientific results of WIRE, and a Final Event of the Memory Route in which the own results and conclusions from the students are presented in the framework of a debate with different actors (victims, groups memorials, policy makers, academics) and show the public some of the WIRE's outcomes.

Academic Conference

It will be the preliminary work for one of the most important and sustainable results of WIRE, the scientific publication of a brand-new interpretative proposal of the Resistance from the female experiences. The Conference will be open for all the academic and non-academic public and will count on the participation of the Memory Route participants.

• **Participants selection and confirmation.** Based on its own expertise, UAB will analyse the current state of the art in transnational studies on War, Resistance, Gender and Violence.

• **Conference.** Travel preparation, accommodation and the Conference completion in Barcelona, Spain, over two days. Will include a keynote speech and four invited lectures. Among the invited guest speakers are Jelena Batinic, Padraic Kenney, Luca Baldissara, Mercedes Yusta and Tasoula Vervenioti.

• Scientific publication. UAB will propose and coordinate the publication of a Special Issue on a JCR-SCOPUS Scientific Journal related to the topics of the Conference.

Final Event

UAB will organize a Final Event to be held in Barcelona immediately after the Academic Conference.

Online Exhibition

It will display the materials and projects created as part of the local events, as well as during the Memory Route activities (podcasts, publications, etc.).

Repository of life stories, biographies, contexts, and historical narratives on female resistance

This user-friendly open-access and joint repository aspires to serve as a research tool and a knowledge framework on female resistance for the public. It also aims to become a platform on female resistance for the dissemination of alternative historical narratives.

It will include the digitalised archives on female resistance, as well as the descriptions of historical contexts and alternative narratives, the selected women biographies and life stories.
