Description: Final Event

Provide a short description of the event and its activities.



The **WP17**, Final Event, was held in Barcelona, in conjunction with **WP16**, Academic Conference, to link the international academic activities showcasing the scientific results of WIRE with the Final Event of the Memory Route.

Specifically, on the first day (30 October), the Academic Conference (**WP16**) took place.

The first session focused on armed and unarmed resistance, featuring contributions from:

Javier Rodrigo (UAB). The opening lecture delivered by Javier Rodrigo focused on the percentage of women who participated in the resistance, highlighting that while women's involvement was substantial, it was simultaneously silenced for multiple reasons.

Mercedes Yusta (Université Paris 8). Yusta's presentation examined the historiographical renewal in the study of women's participation in the postwar anti-Franco armed resistance in Spain, a phenomenon long underappreciated despite its significant social and political impact on rural Spain.

Tasoula Vervenioti (historian). Vervenioti's presentation explored the multifaceted role of women in Greece during World War II, highlighting the fact that their contributions not only reshaped their societal roles but also transformed the political landscape of the resistance.

Roberta Mira (University of Bologna). Mira's presentation highlighted that despite women's significant contribution, post-war recognition of women's activism was limited, overshadowed by military criteria, societal norms, and their own tendency to frame their efforts as natural, personal actions rather than politically motivated ones.

Barbara Klich-Kluczewska (Jagiellonian University). Klich-Kluczewska's presentation emphasized that wartime conditions not only failed to undermine fundamental gender divisions but, in fact, reinforced them, since the female defender, despite being granted the status of a soldier, was primarily relegated to supportive roles.

and *Magda Fytili (UAB)*. Fytili's presentation highlighted the multifaceted and often overlooked contributions of women to resistance movements during the Second World War. By navigating and challenging entrenched societal norms, women not only contributed to liberation struggles but also catalyzed broader social transformations.

Notably, Mercedes Yusta, Tasoula Vervenioti, Roberta Mira, Barbara Klich-Kluczewska, and Magda Fytili are also contributors to the University Journal of Military History (RUHM) Special Issue: War, Female Resistance, and Gendered Violence in Europe.


